Since forming at the Royal Northern College of Music in 2007, the Benyounes String Quartet have forged a reputation for fresh, vivid performances and interpretations of refinement and integrity. They have won prizes in both the Orlando International String Quartet Competition and the Sándor Végh Competition in Budapest. The Benyounes have performed at the Verbier, Aix-en-Provence, Aldeburgh and West Cork Chamber Music Festivals.

For this concert they will be joined by Hélène Clément, the prize-winning French violist of the Doric Quartet, to play first Mozart's brooding, dark 4th String Quintet which escapes onto the sunny uplands only in the last movement. The Adagio from one of Bruckner's few chamber works follows full of his characteristic long melodies and rich chromatic harmonies. Finally the mood lifts for Dvořák's last Quintet, composed in remote Spillville, Iowa, and, like all his American works, infused with his impressions of the indigenous music of America.

Australian born Craig Ogden is one of the most exciting and recorded guitarists of his generation. He has a huge following and is one of Classic FM's most played artists. He is Head of Guitar at RNCM and Visiting Lecturer at London's Royal College of Music. For his second visit to Ilkley he is joined by Serbian-born classical accordionist, Miloš Milivojević. An ambassador for the classical accordion, Miloš is widely known for his versatility in different genres, including classical, tango and world music, which has ensured he is in international demand.

They play a programme which ranges from the baroque to the modern and geographically from Argentina and Paraguay to the Czech Republic and Soviet Russia. As well as hearing both our players as soloists, we shall enjoy works both arranged and written for the unusual combination of quitar and accordion.

The owner of 'a disarmingly profound and mercurial virtuosity', Leon McCawley 'seduces the listener by a spontaneous performance devoid of any sense of narcissism'. In 1993 Leon won first prize in the International Beethoven Piano Competition in Vienna and second prize at the Leeds International Piano Competition. After an absence of several years, during which he has continued to forge a highly successful career establishing himself as a pianist of great integrity and variety, Leon makes a long-awaited return to llklev.

He brings a programme which includes sonatas from the classical and romantic period alongside Schumann's mercurial op 1 variations on the name of his imaginary friend, Meta Abegg, and his real friend, Brahms's last piano works. The twentieth century is represented by two of Edinburghbased Hans Gál's piano fugues. We end with Chopin's majestic Polonaise-Fantaisie.

Firmly established as one of this country's leading violinists, Tasmin Little has performed in some of the most prestigious venues on every continent. Her multi-award winning and varied career encompasses concerto and recital performances, master classes, workshops and community outreach. For this recital in her retirement year she is joined by one of Britain's best loved pianists, Martin Roscoe. His enduring popularity and the respect in which he is universally held are built on a deep and thoughtful musicianship allied to an easy rapport with audiences and fellow musicians alike.

These 'old friends' of Ilkley Concert Club will present two established favourites -Beethoven's virtuosic 'Kreutzer' sonata, written for the Afro-European violinist. George Bridgewater - and the richly harmonic Franck violin sonata, a wedding present for the Belgian Eugène Ysaÿe. The spare but atmospheric Nocturne by Lili Boulanger and Brahms contribution to the collaborative 'FAE' sonata, written for Joseph Joachim, complete the programme.

Metamorphoses is made up of British-American clarinettist, Jean Johnson who lives in Edinburgh, Dutch-born violist, Roeland Jagers living in the Netherlands and Crimean-born pianist, Ilona Timchenko who resides in Spain. These players have quickly made a big impact on the international stage since the formation of the group in 2015. Their debut CD 'Metamorphoses' was reviewed rapturously by Gramophone, the performances being described as 'sincere, imaginative and fresh as paint!'

This celebration of the unique combination of viola and clarinet, with their shared alto/tenor pitches, starts with the piece which began it all - Mozart's beautiful Kegelstatt (Skittle Alley) trio. Schumann's 'Fairy Tales' were inspired by the Mozart. These two anchor the twentieth-century works - Leo Smit's trio of 1938, clearly influenced by Les Six, with whom he was associated in Paris - and Jean Françaix's late work which demonstrates his gift for combining striking melodies with fiendish virtuosity.

Needing no introduction to Ilkley and now in its 40th, and final, season, the Endellion String Quartet is renowned as one of the finest quartets in the world. Three of the original players continue to be members. As Gramophone stated in 2013: 'There's always a feeling when listening to the Endellion that you're listening to the Urtext method of quartet playing ... a uniformity of thought and instinct ... allows them to play as a single entity'.

We start with Mendelssohn's fourth quartet, demonstrating the 28-year-old breaking free from the shadow of Beethoven to achieve his own voice. Beethoven's op 95 'Quartetto serioso' - the last of his middle-period follows, with harmonic language prefiguring the developments to follow in the late quartets. Ravel's early string quartet. although it failed to gain approval from his teachers, won the praise of Debussy, catapulted Ravel to public fame and has remained in the repertoire ever since.

Benjamin Appl is the holder of *Gramophone* magazine's award Young Artist of the Year 2016. He was a BBC New Generation Artist in 2014-16 and a Wigmore Hall Emerging Artist for the 2015/16 season. He has appeared at major European venues and became an exclusive Sony classical recording artist in May 2016. His duo partner, the much sought-after pianist, Simon Lepper, has, since 2013, been an official accompanist for the BBC Cardiff Singer of the World Competition.

Their recital takes the theme of the Wanderer and combines Vaughan Williams' 1904 settings of Robert Louis Stephenson's poems – 'Songs of Travel' – with Mahler's 'Songs of a Wayfarer' from twenty years before. Although both cycles hymn the delights of being free amid the glories of the natural world, Stephenson's traveller is more phlegmatic than the tortured and deserted lover of Mahler's songs, whose character relates back to the spirit of the romantic verse which Schubert sets in the opening collection of lieder.

The Brook Street Band takes its name from the London street where Handel lived from 1723-1759. The band was formed in 1996 and rapidly established itself as one of the UK's leading Handel specialist ensembles. Promoting eighteenth-century chamber repertoire has always been the band's driving passion and it has recently set up its own music festival in Norfolk, 'love:Handel'.

For our final concert a band of eleven players will feature violin and flute soloists in familiar Bach works. These sandwich two concertos for strings by Handel [although one is disguised as a sonata!] together with Geminiani's orchestral reworking of Corelli's 12th violin sonata which comprises a set of variations on the famous tune - the 'follies of Spain'. Muffat also features a set of variations in the fifth sonata from his first set, published three years before Bach and Handel were born!
